Subject: **Crime Awareness and Campus Security Act of 1990 Annual Report**

It is the mission of Haywood Community College and Campus Security to provide the safest educational environment possible for all faculty, staff, students and visitors at all HCC locations.

Known and suspected violations of Federal and State laws and other emergencies should be reported to the Campus Security department for action.

Access to Haywood Community College facilities is from 6:30 AM until 11:00 PM with key control allowing access to sensitive areas and after hours building entry. An instructor must accompany students wishing to access locked areas, or no access will be permitted.

The Haywood Community College Campus Security department is comprised of non-sworn officers with authority granted by N.C.G.S. 74-C. The department receives support from local and state agencies having jurisdiction. The Security office is located in the Frizell Administration building (100) room 119 and is staffed 24 hours a day.

Crime awareness is addressed at Faculty Orientation annually and at Student Orientation and safety brochures are available throughout the year.

Faculty, staff and students must recognize that they must take individual steps to protect themselves from becoming a victim of a crime and work together as a campus community in the prevention of crime and promotion of security.

Students participating in off-campus (college sponsored) activities need to report criminal incidents to the local law enforcement agency having jurisdiction, and inform Haywood Community College Campus Security as soon as possible after the incident.

Haywood Community College promotes a drug and alcohol free environment and supports this nationwide movement. Haywood Community College is committed to maintaining such an environment for all employees and students.

The Haywood Community College strongly supports State and Federal laws concerning sexual assault and sexual harassment. Any violation or complaint should be made immediately to Security or to the Vice President of Student Services. Victims are entitled to all services of HCC and available County services provided.

These crime statistics are gathered from the Campus Security logs and reports, Student Services, Counseling Service and Local Law Enforcement agencies having jurisdiction on and near campus property.

The North Carolina State Bureau of Investigation has set up a searchable web site with information on all registered sex offenders in this state. Security recommends that you visit this site often.
