BEGINNING WEAVING 101: FLOOR LOOM

In this six week course, learn every step of beginning weaving on a floor loom including designing a warp with multiple colors, dressing the loom back to front, and exploring weaving in both plain weave and twill structures. You will learn weaving terminology, how to calculate quantities of yarn needed for a project, how to plan warp dimensions, and gain an overview of finishing techniques. By the end of the class you will leave with "color and weave" cloth samples and either a set of dishtowels, placemats, or a scarf. You will have a solid foundation for weaving on your own after the class.

Through a series of projects, students will become familiar with the basic tools and techniques used to make jewelry from metal. We will learn to safely cut, shape, and texture metal, make connections through riveting and soldering, and apply finishing techniques such as polishing and patinas. The techniques learned in this class will be well-suited to those who'd like to have a small studio at home, and you will receive guidance about the essential tools needed to get started. With each project you will see a demonstration of the techniques we are learning and be given supplies to make your own design using those techniques. This class can be your first step to a life long practice in the art of metal smithing, or just a chance to try something new and make some of your own art from metal.

ADVANCED METALSMITHING

Continue your jewelry making journey as you take your metal smithing skills to the next level. The basic skills you've acquired are just the starting place. In this class you will refine your sawing, soldering and other skills as you see your design come to life. Students will create a one of a kind pendant with a bezel set stone. (Your stone can be oval or round, the minimum size is about the size of a quarter, but can be larger.) Add wire or metal overlay embellishments for a unique look.

Techniques covered include: design and workflow for a custom project, bezel setting a stone of your choice, making twisted wire for decorative borders, sweat soldering sheet metal overlays, more precision soldering skills, fabricating a bail, and advanced piercing skills.

ABS INTRODUCTION TO BLADESMITHING

Instructor: ABS Certified Master Bladesmith Location: Walnut Building, #3327 & #3337

Tuition: \$1381.25

This class is for beginning knifemakers. Students will be introduced to the concepts and techniques needed to make a knife. Students are taught metal selection, blade function and different blade designs will be discussed. Hand forging to shape, normalizing, heat treating, grinding and tempering will all be taught. These semifinished blades will be tested for their cutting ability, edge holding, hardness and flexibility. Students should be able to make a blade which will pass the equivalent of a Journeyman Smith Performance Test. Successful completion of this course will reduce the required three year waiting period as an ABS Journeyman Smith judging in two years. This is a two-week long class and will be taught by an ABS Certified Master Bladesmith.


