

# Program & Technical Standards for Cosmetology Majors

### Concerns with a Course

## **Program Outcomes**

The Cosmetology degree program is designed to facilitate development of the following program outcomes:

- 1. Identify and practice laws (General Statutes, Chapter 88) governing salons and schools.
- 2. Demonstrate and explain safety procedures and precautions while completing assignments.
- 3. Demonstrate first aid treatments for various injuries that may occur in the cosmetology clinic or a salon.
- 4. Practice managing a salon, with dispensary duties.
- 5. Identify diseases and disorders of the hair and scalp; identify which can be treated by cosmologists and which must be referred to physician.
- 6. Demonstrate the proper techniques for draping, shampooing, conditioning, reconditioning and scalp massage.
- 7. Practice and demonstrate proper procedures for design.
- 8. Practice and demonstrate proper procedures for sculpture.
- 9. Practice and demonstrate proper procedures for perm designs.
- 10. Practice and demonstrate proper procedures for color design.
- 11. Identify diseases and disorder of the nail and identify which must be referred to physician.
- 12. Practice and demonstrate proper procedures for manicuring.
- 13. Practice and demonstrate proper procedures for pedicuring.
- 14. Practice and demonstrate proper procedures for nail enhancements.
- 15. Identify diseases and disorders of the skin and identify which must be referred to a physician.
- 16. Practice and demonstrate proper procedures for facials.
- 17. Practice and demonstrate proper procedures for hair removal.
- 18. Practice and demonstrate proper procedures for makeup applications.
- 19. Demonstrate and practice professional relationships and behavior with clients, faculty, and fellow students.
- 20. Identify characteristics of professional behavior as it relates to: attitude, ethics, personality, and hygiene.
- 21. Demonstrate professional communication skills and how to do a client consultation.
