15-week course designed for those individuals who are seriously interested in becoming beekeepers and maintaining a honey bee apiary. Prior knowledge about honeybees not required. Subjects will include: Science of apiculture, types of honeybees, purchasing, equipment, clothing and the importance of honey bees to the environment. You will receive practical experience with building and setting up beehives, managing an apiary, controlling hive pests/diseases, and preparing for the NC State Beekeepers Certification test. Students will also document hive inspections, analyze honey, estimate hive populations, and learn how to prepare colonies for winter. Note; if you have any bee allergies then, this course IS NOT RECOMMENDED for you. Safety masks will be required and students will be responsible for purchasing Prof. Grade Bee Suit/jacket, protective gloves, a beekeeping supplies starting kit, and a tack or frame hammer.

BRINGING IN THE HEAT

Instructor: Nirado Sloan

With basic skills behind us and an ability to create metal jewelry, we move on to joining metals with heat and cold connections with rivets. Students will explore, practice, and develop a love for joining metals with solder and heat. In level 1 the torch was introduced to teach students how to use heat to soften metal for forming. In level two we expand our skills to joining metals together to create a form and design. How to purchase materials will be part of the lessons of the class and students will purchase their own materials as part of the learning process. The projects in this class are wire bangle, chain bracelet, spinner ring, earrings, pendant with or without prong set stone. The student will be working with wire and sheet metal, copper or silver, patina or not to patina. The projects are chosen to help develop the skills being taught. Construction Skills & Technology

CORE: INTRODUCTION TO BASIC CONSTRUCTION SKILLS

Next class starts in January/February 2024

CORE is designed for people with little or no experience in the building industry. We'll discuss career opportunities in construction, jobsite safety, math fundamentals, hand and power tool usage, construction drawings, and material handling—plus communications and employability skills to help with the job search process. Earn your OSHA-10 construction industry safety certification and a CORE credential from NCCER. CORE is mainly a discussion-based, in-theclassroom course. Students will also spend approximately two to three weeks in the Construction Technology lab, getting handson practice with construction tools. Up to 117 hours.

PLUMBING – LEVEL 1

Next class starts in January 2024

Discover how water distribution and drain/waste/vent (DWV) systems work—so you can start learning to install, maintain, and repair them. Plumbing–Level 1 looks at the tools, drawings, and applied math used every day by plumbing professionals, along with safety issues and codes specific to the industry. You'll be introduced to a range of plumbing fixtures, as well as techniques for working with different types of piping and fittings—PVC, PEX, copper, cast iron, and steel. Plumbing–Level 1 can provide you with the fundamental skills and knowledge to start a rewarding career in this highdemand field. (NCCER requires completion of CORE before awarding additional NCCER credentials.) Min. 144 hours.

HEATING, VENTILATION, AIR CONDITIONING & REFRIGERATION (HVACR) – LEVEL 1

Next classes start in January/February 2024

Begin exploring the basics of heating, ventilation, air conditioning, and refrigeration (HVACR) work. This course will introduce you to different types of equipment and systems, as well as a variety of piping practices. You'll also learn about the fundamentals of electricity and will look at some of the components and electrical instruments used in HVACR system installation and service. Other topics include codes, standards, and related math skills, plus an overview of the licensure and certification process for HVACR technicians. HVACR Level 1 can get you started down the path to becoming a journeyman technician in this dynamic, high-tech field. (NCCER requires completion of CORE before awarding additional NCCER credentials.) Min. 144 hours.

CONSTRUCTION TECHNOLOGY (CT)

Understanding a variety of construction techniques can help you build a solid foundation for any career path in the building trades. Construction Technology classes will cover all phases of the residential building process—from foundations, to framing, to exterior finish work—plus other skills you'll need to be familiar with on a jobsite. Practice working safely and efficiently while expanding your overall construction knowledge. (NCCER requires completion of CORE before awarding additional NCCER credentials.)

CT I – RESIDENTIAL CARPENTRY

Class lengths will vary depending on included topics This class will focus on basic framing and other fundamental carpentry skills needed to construct single-family dwellings. Topics will include floor and wall systems, simple stair layout and construction, and ceiling joist and roof framing principles. Additional topics may include exterior finish, roofing, and basic cabinet construction and installation.

CT II – SPECIAL TOPICS IN BUILDING

Class lengths will vary depending on included topics This "special topics" course will look at some of the noncarpentry skilled craft trades involved in homebuilding. Explore the fundamentals of masonry, plumbing, HVAC, electrical, and heavy equipment operation. Increase your understanding of the services performed by key residential subcontractors to help you better evaluate their work or to help you choose a career path in the construction industry.

Notary Public Education

Tuition: \$103 (includes current notary manual) **Location:** Public Services Training Facility, #9105 This course covers the qualifications, procedures, and certification for becoming a notary. Pursuant to the NC Notary Act, to apply for commissioning as a notary you must: be 18 years of age or older and a legal resident of the U.S.; be able to speak, read and write English; have a high school diploma or equivalent; and reside or have a regular place of work or business in N.C. Upon completion of this course with a passing exam grade of 80%, a person is eligible to make application with the NC Secretary of state office. The required textbook, Notary Public Guidebook for North Carolina, is included in the cost of the course and can be picked up prior to class at the Public Safety Training Facility (9000 building) with proof of registration and payment. Students are encouraged to read through the textbook prior to attending the course. Students must present a current photo ID to be admitted to class.
