
Our primary goal is to keep students and employees safe, which may result in rescheduling or cancelling classes. Students who are enrolled in classes that have been





AXE & AWL LEATHERWORKS

Courtney and Spencer Tetrault established Axe & Awl Leatherworks six years ago as an online business. Coming from two rewarding yet demanding careers, this required a leap of faith and a whole lot of grit. Now, they are taking another leap of faith to pursue a much-anticipated dream of opening a storefront on Depot Street in downtown Waynesville.

“Seeing members of the community, visitors to our beautiful town, and fellow business owners encouraging and lifting us up with support has been an already remarkable experience” Spencer Explains.

Inside the shop, it’s hustle and bustle while the hands-on work continues. The hides come into the shop in huge rolls and are cut down to size. With a team of three, each handmade piece is stitched, hand-stamped, beveled and burnished with attention to detail, promising the end result is a durable, personalized product that’s a homage to the past.

The journey for these entrepreneurs began as a hobby on the kitchen island of their home. Spencer bought a box of tools and put them to use, making customized, durable products for firefighters such as belts, suspenders, and radio straps. Outgrowing the island, the hobby moved into the garage and then the basement. The product line also evolved into wallets, bags, keychains and more.

As their children grew older, they realized their careers were taking them away from their kids too much. The grueling shifts of being a firefighter for Spencer and a paramedic for Courtney weighed heavy on them.

“We made the challenging decision to leave those careers,” Courtney says. “Turns out one of the hardest decisions was also one of the best decisions we have ever made.”

While it takes a lot of dedication and man-hours to run a business, they are able to spend more time with family, where everyone helps out. Courtney’s brother, Travis, makes up the third member of their team.



Through Axe & Awl, history for the town of Waynesville is repeating itself. Years ago, there was a tannery in town. Lots of families had a connection to the tannery. This is precisely what the Tetraults envision happening again.

Besides offering durable handmade leather goods, Axe & Awl plans to eventually offer classes where people in the community can learn to make their own items, such as a belt or wallet.

Emergency Medical Services (EMS) is a system that provides emergency medical care and transportation of sick and injured patients. EMS is most easily recognized when emergency vehicles or helicopters are seen responding to emergency incidents. EMS is much more than a ride to the hospital, though. It is a system of coordinated response and emergency medical care, involving multiple people and agencies. A comprehensive EMS system is ready every day for every kind of emergency.

ADVANCED EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN (AEMT)

EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN (EMT)

EMTs provide out-of-hospital emergency care and transportation for sick or injured patients who access the EMS system. EMTs have the basic knowledge and skills necessary to stabilize and safely transport patients ranging from non-emergency and routine medical transports to life-threatening emergencies. Obtain certification as an EMT by completing 24 hours of field rotations. Students also need to have a GED/HS Diploma or reading comprehension of 11th grade or higher. Next class begins September 6. BASIC LAW ENFORCEMENT TRAINING

Basic Law Enforcement Training (BLET) is designed to give students essential skills required for entry-level employment as law enforcement officers with state, county, or municipal governments, or with private enterprise. This program utilizes State commission-mandated topics and methods of instruction. General subjects include, but are not limited to, criminal, juvenile, civil, traffic, and alcohol beverage laws, investigative, patrol, custody, and court procedures, emergency responses, and ethics and community relations. The next delivery of the Basic Law Enforcement Training will be a night class that will begin in September of 2021. Packets are available now and will be due by August 15th.

DETENTION OFFICER CERTIFICATION

This certification-related Detention Officer Certification Course (DOCC) is offered under guidelines and requirements as set forth by North Carolina Sheriffs' Education and Training Standards Commission. Properly certified state instructors are used in all topic areas.

Trainees must successfully pass a State-administered exam as well as demonstrate competency in all skill areas in order to be eligible for certification as a detention officer. Lecture, demonstrations, and practical exercises are primary methods of instruction.

The next delivery of the Detention Officer Certification Course will be a day class that will begin October 4, 2021.

IN-SERVICE TRAINING

Mandatory in-service training for law enforcement personnel for 2022 will begin in February. Topics will vary based on NCDOJ requirements.

TASER CERTIFICATION


The TASER course is designed to certify the user in the use of the TASER Conducted Electrical Weapon (CEW). A brief overview of CEW technology, medical safety, and tactical considerations will be covered. The effects of the TASER and deploying the TASER in various practical applications will be included as well. TASER exposure is mandatory. This class is for currently certified Law Enforcement Officers.

PEPPER SPRAY CERTIFICATION

Gain detailed information involved in the use of all types and forms of Oleoresin Capsicum aerosol projectors. The course covers all aspects involved in the selection, preparation, deployment, storage, and legal ramifications regarding the use of all OC products. This class is for currently certified Law Enforcement Officers. Exposure is mandatory for initial certification. All students who are exposed will be required to shower before leaving the campus, so please bring a change of clothes.

High school junior or senior eligibility requirements:

- a. Have an unweighted, cumulative GPA of 2.8 or higher on high school courses; or
- b. Demonstrate college readiness in English, reading and mathematics on an assessment.

- a. Have the recommendation of the high school principal or his/her designee and have the high school principal or his/her designee's rationale for recommendation in place of GPA requirement; and

The Career and College Promise program allows eligible high school students to earn college credit, tuition-free. Students who meet academic eligibility requirements are able to enroll in college classes through career technical education or college transfer pathways. Courses in these dual credit programs are taught on the high school campuses, at Haywood Community College (HCC), and online. Career and College Promise students have the opportunity to meet two graduation requirements, both in high school and college, simultaneously, allowing them to save time and money.

PHM 3250 Pharmacy Technician*

A career as a pharmacy technician prepares students to assist the pharmacist in dispensing medications and advancing patient safety.

Upon successful completion of the program, students are eligible to take the Pharmacy Technician Certification Examination® (PTCE®) which prepares students to become a Certified Pharmacy Technician (CPhT).



EMS 4200 Emergency Medical Technician*

EMTs provide out-of-hospital emergency care and transportation for sick or injured patients who access the EMS system. EMTs have the basic knowledge and skills necessary to stabilize and safely transport patients ranging from nonemergency and routine medical transports to life-threatening emergencies.

PREREQUISITES:

1. 17 years of age on or before the official end date of the course.
2. Possession of a high school diploma, high school equivalency or successful completion of an exam assessing basic reading comprehension skills at a minimum at the eleventh-grade level.

FIP 3031 Fire Fighter Training Block I*

This course includes Orientation, Fire Service Communications, Firefighter Health & Safety, Personal Protective Equipment, Building Construction, Portable Extinguishers, Fire Behavior, Tools and Forcible Entry, and Loss Control.

FIP 3032 Fire Fighter Training Block II*

This course includes Ladders, Ventilation, Ropes & Knots, Search & Rescue, Water Supplies, Hose, Streams, and Appliances, and Emergency Medical Care.



Instructor: Kerry Garvin


